FROM THE PASTOR...

As I write this, we are only two days past the bombing at the Boston Marathon. Of course, on a smaller scale, we are reminded of the events of 9/11. By the time you read this, we may well know who is behind this cowardly act, and whether it is international or domestic terrorism, or just one sick minded person. I went back to re-read an article so well written by Dr. Tony Cartledge in the aftermath of 9/11, regarding this type of evil in the world. He wrote, "God allows evil to exist in the world because real freedom cannot exist apart from the possibility of choosing between good and evil. But God is not the author of evil. The Bible consistently challenges God's people to avoid evil and do good (Psalm 34:14; Amos 5:14; Romans 12:9; I Peter 3:11). Paul, who was well acquainted with violence and persecution, believed God could work together with believers to bring good from all things – even those that are evil (Romans 8:28). He insisted that Christian people should not be overcome with evil, but work to overcome evil with good (Romans 12:21)."

Dr. Cartledge concluded his thoughts, "As we struggle for proper ways to respond to this awful assault on our nation and our collective sense of security, we must recognize it for what it is, as evil. And ultimately, there is only one way to overcome evil -- with good. Find something good to do and do it."

In that line of thought, Mr. Rogers, of the Children's TV show, Mr. Roger's Neighborhood, said that when he was a child and something bad happened, his mother told him not to concentrate on the bad things, but to "look for the helpers". There would always be those helpers coming to help those in need.

May God help us to always find something good to do and to help someone as we do it, in His name.


Deacon Update


